3. <u>Handwriting Practice</u>: Transcribe a paragraph in neat handwriting on a daily basis in order to develop your handwriting and spelling further.





Decorate the scrapbook and bring it to the school.





ENHANCING SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL LEARNING THROUGH INTERGENERATIONAL CONNECTION

ACTIVITY I :- "LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOUR AS YOURSELF"

HIGH TEA Objective: Foster social and emotional skills, values, and interpersonal connections through an intergenerational high tea event with neighborhood grandparents.

Description:
